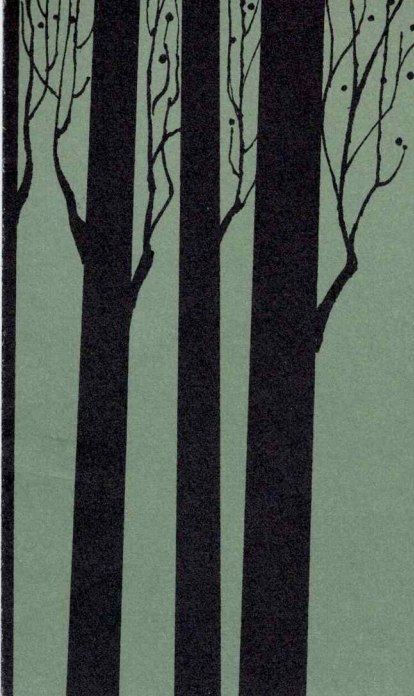




Sometimes you can't find the tree for the forest...

If you want some information on who is running in local, state, or congressional elections, or where and when to vote, or what ballot issues are up for consideration, the League of Women Voters may help you.



If you suddenly think something should be done about our schools or about traffic safety, check with us. We may be studying these problems on our local Programs or we may have studied them in the past and have published our findings in readable form. We may even be in the midst of a campaign building support for better health and wel-

fare services, libraries, recreation and park areas, juvenile courts.

Such activities are all part of League work to help ourselves and other citizens become better informed and take action towards solving some of the problems of our community.

And if you wonder what's up on the state scene, such as reapportionment, fiscal policies, constitutional reform, or on the national scene, such as water conservation, the United Nations, foreign economic policy, try us again.



We study, publish materials, and act on state and national issues, too, and we try to help inform citizens to take action on issues they are concerned about.

But, in order for us to do all this, we need money for get-out-the-vote campaigns, candidates meetings, fact-finding studies, distribution of materials, drives for better local and state services.

So once a year we hold a finance drive and we hope this year you will be among our supporters.
