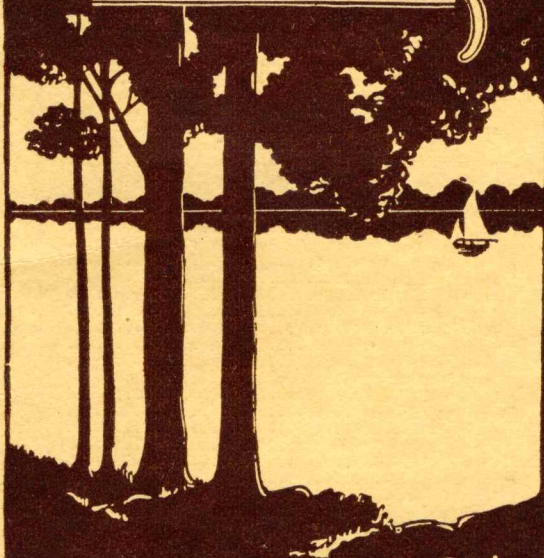

DECATUR

DECATUR was named for Commodore Decatur, the American admiral. It is located in central Illinois, the heart of the rich upper Mississippi valley, which produces the greater part of the food-stuffs and live stock of the United States. This area is underlain with bituminous coal, the largest field in the country. There is a mine within the limits of Decatur itself. This joint wealth of farm and mine is of utmost economic value.

Transportation facilities include four steam and one electric railroad and Illinois paved highways in eight directions. A combined bus and street car system reaches all points in the city.

The city is amply supplied with water from Lake Decatur, an artificial lake, 14 miles long, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to 1 mile wide, holding eight billion gallons. The lake is 4,000 acres in area. The dam, pumping plant, and water distributing system are owned by the city.

Population

The 1930 national census found Decatur's population to be 57,511. This population was analyzed as follows:

Native born white, 92%; foreign born, 5.5%; negroes, 2.5%.

Decatur's population in 1920 was 43,818.

Recreation

Expenses of the park district are paid by the taxes levied and by income from the fees for golf and concessions in the parks. Taxes collected each year amount to approximately \$65,000. Concessions, golf fees and miscellaneous income totals from \$12,000 to \$15,000. The park board issued \$432,000 in bonds for the purchase of land and improvements, of which \$398,000 is outstanding.

The golf course is in Nelson Park. It has 18 holes and the fee is 25 cents a round; ten round tickets for \$2, and non-transferable unlimited season tickets, \$10. Nelson Park also has a swimming beach with bath house that cost \$25,000. Row-boats and canoes may be hired at the boat house.

A rock garden of unusual beauty is an attraction that draws thousands to Nelson Park at all seasons.

A lake shore drive is under construction with three miles completed. A bridle path, in a portion of wooded park land, west of Fairview park is laid out. The Mary Seaman wild flower garden is located in Fairview park. Fire wood is provided in Fairview and Nelson parks for parties who go there for wiener roasts in the fall. Picnic grounds are maintained in these parks and a number of the smaller ones.

A feature of historical interest in Decatur is the first log court house built in Macon County, now located in Fairview park. It was built in 1829 on Lincoln Square and was used by Abraham Lincoln while in that location.

Tennis and croquet courts, baseball diamonds, horseshoe pitching grounds and archery fields are maintained for the public in Fairview and a number of the other parks.

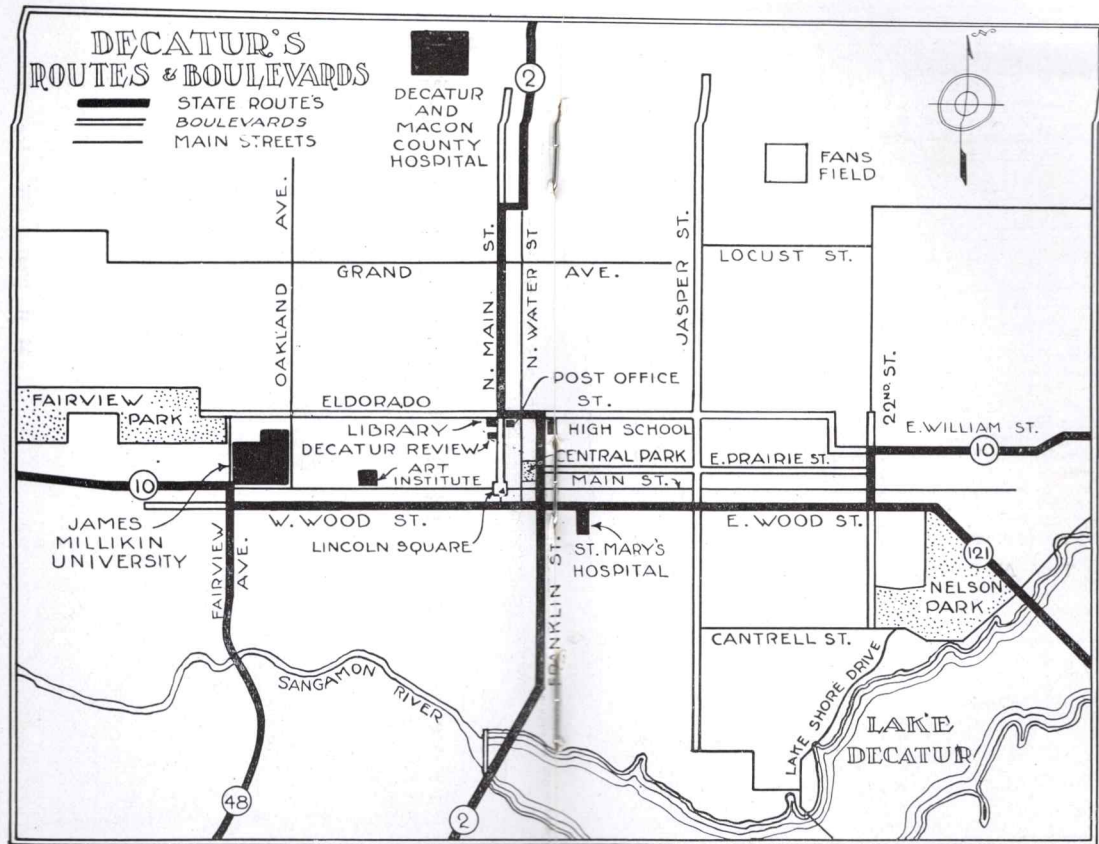
