

Regular Meeting of the Library Board

July 26, 1929

Present: Messrs. Hardy, Shade, Mrs. Gastman, Mrs. Vincent, and Mrs. Evans.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Librarian's report was read, on motion approved, and ordered placed on file.

Unfinished business: After investigation it was found that the minimum cost of a fairly good float in the Centennial parade would be \$100.00. As this was more than the limit set to be expended, and as the library did not wish to enter unless with a creditable exhibit, the idea was abandoned.

The report of the work of members of the Building & Grounds, and Finance committees, together with the president of the Board, on having the children's room and two offices on main floor decorated, and two stacks of shelving built in the children's room, was accepted by the Board.

There were three bids for the painting: Charles Pease Co. for \$230.00; Myer & Son for \$179.50; Spence & Graybill for \$147.35. The work was given to the lowest bidder.

It was decided to have the concrete at the north end of the entrance steps, at the sidewalk line, repaired.

A steel filing case was purchased for the War records and the wooden case transferred to the children's room where much needed.

The Board was reorganized for the year, with Mr. Hardy re-elected president, and Miss Dill, secretary.

It was reported that the steel newspaper stacks ordered three months ago had been installed.
